"Guillermo Trujillo: 10 Years of Painting 1990-2000," 30 works on canvas by Trujillo, regarded as Panama's pre-eminent artist, is on exhibit at the Museum of Latin American Art, 628 Alamitos Ave., Long Beach, through Aug. 12. Many of Trujillo's compositions are controlled by the power of the nucho, a ceremonial baton used for Panamanian rites. In his work, Trujillo gives the nuchos modern, human form, making metaphors for human action and interaction, as well as for spiritual encounters and transformations. Museum hours are 11:30 a.m.-7:30 p.m. Tuesday-Friday, 11 a.m.-7:30 p.m. Saturday and 11 a.m.-5 p.m. Sunday. Admission is \$7 for adults, \$5 for seniors and students, and free for ages under 12 and museum members. (562) 437-1689.
